c. <u>Supplemental Textbook Proposal CHS - Katherine Hastings</u>

Katherine Hastings represented the English Department and requested a change in supplemental textbooks for *the Journalism: Publishing Across the Media* course. The English Department would like to integrate *Jennifer Government* into the course. *Jennifer Government* is a novel written by Max Barry, published in 2003. The novel is set in the future and portrays a country run by privatized entities thus limiting federal and state governments' powers. 30 copies will be needed.
