Ms. <u>Taylor</u> welcomed back Ms. Smart as a substitute teacher in the District.

Ms. <u>Curran</u> thanked Mr. Bruce for volunteering to serve as a substitute.

Mr. <u>Buono</u> requested an update on the Genet water damage repairs project. Dr. <u>Nagle</u> reported the bulk of the work will be completed during April break. The 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the Administration Center will have carpet replacement, some new drywall, and molding. Room 100 of Genet will be used as a staging area and be completed during Memorial Day recess. The stage and band room will also be refinished in April.

Dr. <u>Harrison</u> appreciated the work of administration, building principals, and union members to reduce employee absences prior to and after holidays. He said that focus should shift to reducing total substitute cost, which is on track to be the same as the \$1.3 million spent in 2014-2015. Dr. <u>Harrison</u> shared that a 10% reduction in absences would produce savings for other projects.

Ms. <u>Maciol</u> spoke about a parent concern on overseas student trips due to recent terrorist attacks. She said this is an issue in a number of schools that is creating concern among families, but recognized it is an individual family decision.

Dr. <u>Nagle</u> said the issue is creating much discussion among Suburban Council superintendents. A number of local schools have planned trips in the next four months, although none are planning to cancel and are leaving the decision to families.

Dr. <u>Harrison</u> noted there is an overseas trip in April, but that it is a private trip not sanctioned by the school district.

Dr. <u>Nagle</u> was unaware of any school-sponsored overseas trips in the District.

Mr. <u>Buono</u> said the Technology Committee had a discussion about purchasing Chromebooks and 1:1 initiatives in local school districts. There also was an update on g-mail for student access and computer-based testing.

She also encouraged participation in the pasta dinner fundraiser for the Science Olympiad team which will be traveling to national competition for the second year in a row.
