Young people are pretty good at coming up with excuses, but even the best excuse-maker needs help sometimes. When the pressure is on, they may need to have prepared come-backs.

You can help them prepare.

(Give a reason)

Can't do that.

Addiction runs
in my family.

(Make an excuse)

My dad would take my phone away if he found out I did that.

(Leave the situation.

Text a code to a family member or friend to call for an emergency.)

Sorry, I have to go.

(Make a joke)

No thank you.
I need all the
brain cells that
I can get.

(Offer an alternative that shows you value the person)

Maybe we can just head to the movies instead.

(Just say no, plainly and firmly; repeat if necessary)

No thank you, I'd prefer not to.

What else could you suggest?
