Curriculum Grades 9-12 (Required Instructional Hours: **990 per year or 248 per quarter**)
The UNITS are cumulative requirements for grades nine through twelve. The time suggestions are provided as a MODEL to assist in assessing equivalency:

English (4 units)	1 unit per year Minimum of 36 minutes per day @ 5 days per week (180 minutes per week – each year) 1 unit = 180 minutes per week for 1 year
Mathematics (3 units)	Minimum of 36 minutes per day @ 5 days per week (180 minutes per week – each year) 1 unit = 180 minutes per week for 1 year
Science (3 units) -Physical Environment Science (such as Earth Science) -Physical Life Science (such as Biology) -Life or Physical Science	Minimum of 36 minutes per day @ 5 days per week (180 minutes per week – each year) 1 unit = 180 minutes per week for 1 year
Social Studies (4 units) -Geography -Global History -US History -Economics (as ½ unit) -Government (as ½ unit)	1 unit per year Minimum of 36 minutes per day @ 5 days per week (180 minutes per week – each year) 1 unit = 180 minutes per week for 1 year or ½ unit = 90 minutes per week for 1 year
Health (1/2 unit) (including. HIV/AIDS, alcohol/drug/tobacco abuse, fire/highway/bicycle safety, child abuse)	90 minutes per week
Music, Visual Arts, Dance and/or Theater (1 unit)	90 minutes per week each ½ unit – can be done over multiple years
Physical Education (2 units – ½ unit every year)	90 minutes per week
*Language other than English (1 unit)	180 minutes per week
Electives (3 ½ units)

*Students with a disability may be excused from the requirement for 1 unit of credit in World Language if so indicated on their IEP, but they must still earn 22 units of credit to graduate.
