


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Multicultural Fair

funny sunglasses, special treats and more.




Alaina Marino '23 Wins Award at Greater Capital Region Science and Engineering Fair

Columbia High School senior Alaina Marino was awarded the <u>American Society for Microbiology Award</u> at the ISEF/Greater Capital Region Science and Engineering Fair hosted by Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

Ms. Marino's project titled "A Comparative Analysis of Microbial pathways in Crohn's disease patients with severe vs non-severe symptoms" is being done through the Columbia Science Research program.

Will Inman Wins Bronze in NYS SkillsUSA Competitions

Columbia High School senior Will Inman '23 won a bronze medal in HVAC at the 2023 NYS SkillsUSA Leadership and Skills Championships in Syracuse. He qualified for the state championships by winning the SkillsUSA Area III Regional competition in March.

SkillsUSA competitions provide a showcase for students to display their skills learned through career and technical education. During the state competition, contestants took a written test and then completed a circuit of different stations where they were tested in their knowledge of HVAC such as heat pumps, propane furnaces, window air conditioner units and compressors.

"It was fun," he said. "I thought of it as a learning experience."

For the past two years, Mr. Inman has attended technical education classes in the <u>HVAC and Renewable Energies</u> program through Questar III BOCES at the Robert H. Gibson Technical School in Troy. He receives classroom instruction and training for HVAC for half of the day at that school and attends regular classes at Columbia for the other half of the day.

As part of his technical education classes, Mr. Inman has learned about the design, installation and repair of HVAC systems and emerging technologies. He also has a part-time job installing HVAC systems for a local company.

Following graduation in June, Mr. Inman plans on attending SUNY Delhi to study Plumbing and HVAC.




Three Students Nominated for High School Musical Theatre Awards

Each of the other projects were presented by college students, college professors and professionals from environmental organizations such as the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, the NYS Water Resources Institute, and Riverkeeper.

Ms. Ilse's project is titled "Microplastic analysis of high-flow and low flow streams located in Rensselaer County," which is being done through Columbia's Science Research program. She was joined at the symposium by her mentor Dr. Jacqueline Smith, a research professor of geosciences from Union College.

"Inara has accumulated many hours working on this project that she is very passionate about," said Columbia Science Teacher Heidi Gleason who coordinates the Science Research program. "Her being asked to present her work in such a venue is remarkable."
