5. PUBLIC FORUM #1

Dr. Wanda McQueen acknowledged the newly retiring transportation staff members, Kathy Schmidt, Nate Sanford and Rich Harrat. She spoke of their combined 68 years of service to the District and community, and wished them all a long, happy and healthy retirement.

Ms. Alison Savoca, EGTA president, congratulated all the EGTA mentor, mentees, retirees, newly tenured teachers and related service providers that were being recognized during this meeting.

6. REPORTS AND PRESENTATIONS - SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

A. Recognition of 2023-2024 Tenured Staff, Mentees & Mentors, Student Council Representatives and Retirees of the East Greenbush Central School District- Jeffrey P. Simons, Superintendent

Mr. Simons congratulated the newly tenured staff. He reported that several years ago, the New York State Education Department increased the standards required to receive tenure. He explained that the tenure process is now a four-year process where staff have to demonstrate that they are progressing, advancing, meeting the needs of the students and are always improving their craft.

The Superintendent thanked the Administrative Staff, Teachers and Teaching Assistants that attained tenure for all they have done to support the students and the District.

The Superintendent explained that public schools in New York State are required to provide a mentoring program to support all new teachers. He congratulated the Mentors and Mentees for completing the year. He acknowledged the work of the Mentors for sharing their expertise and helping support the new teachers.

Mr. Simons also thanked Student Council representatives, Roan Butterfield and Kole Hardy, for coming to all the Board meetings, keeping everyone updated on events at the high school, and all the things they do in the community.

Mr. Simons congratulated the retirees, and recognized all the years of dedication and the impact they have had on many students. He said that while the District will miss their contributions and seeing them on a daily basis, it will take comfort in the fact that they have served the community well in helping the children receive their education. He said the retirees will always be members of the East Greenbush Central School District family, and he hopes to see some of them back substituting or just stopping in to say hello. Mr. Simons thanked all the retirees for all their years of service to the District.

B. Capital Project Planning

Mr. Simons reported that staff is continuing to meet with the architects and construction team to outline phasing of the projects and the timing of the bids. He said they also have established a Capital Project Coordinating team. He invited up to four board members to join the team to hear plans being made and provide input. The Superintendent also shared that the Genet playground is almost complete and the ribbon cutting ceremony to officially open the playground will take place in the next week or so.

C. Elevating and Empowering Student Voices ~ Columbia Student Leaders & Advisor Marna Meltzer-McMorris

Mr. Buono stated his support of the program that he felt it was very important for students to be heard. He said their efforts are a perfect addition to the Board's efforts to improve the overall school climate.

Ms. Jodie Sullivan explained the program began when Questar III BOCES put together a regional DEI taskforce, to engage school district leaders in conversations around diversity, equity, inclusivity, and access to education. After the program they realized they needed student input and involvement. She said the Columbia team collaborated with four other area districts, and students were trained as discussion leaders and discussion facilitators in topics of climate and culture.

The Columbia team came back to the District and created a student survey asking questions about Columbia High School. Students were asked questions about what students like about the school, things they would like changed, the meaning of an inclusive school environment, and what an inclusive school would look like. Students were given post-it notes to answer the questions, and then everyone read the notes and discussed the answers and ways to achieve change in the overall climate.

Ms. Skumurski asked if they would like to expand the program next year.

The students said they might present the survey to different students next year to build on the program.

Ms. Steinbach said the program sounds amazing. She said she would like to spend more time reviewing the results of the survey and hoped they can use the data for change. Ms. Steinbach said she thought the program was a great way to educate and empower the students on what to do if they see something happening that they know is wrong. She suggested they should also reach out to State leaders for assistance.

Mr. Dunn told the students these lessons will serve them well in their lives. He encouraged them to continue their advocacy throughout their lives.

Mr. Temple said he was excited about the program and change starts with conversation. He said this program is helping the District to move in the right direction and encouraged the students to continue their work.

Mr. Mann stated his support of the program and said he hoped the program could grow with more districts joining.

7. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Draft Board of Education Schedule for 2024-2025

Mr. Simons reported that there was some slight changes to the Board meeting calendar due to conflicts. He said changes to the August meetings will help with staffing, since some candidates need to give 30 days notice at their current positions and this change will ensure they are available to start on opening day.

B. Portrait of a Graduate / Alignment with Board Goals

Mr. Simons reported that the Portrait of a Graduate initiative is part of Learning 2025, a growth program the District has joined that is sponsored by the National Association of School Administrators. He explained that a number of teachers and principals attended a conference last fall, and the program is basically a vision of skills you would like your students to attain before graduation, which will help them be prepared for a changing world. Skills like adaptability and communication.

Mr. Stiles explained it is a program for all students, Pre-K through grade 12. He said the design team is made up of teachers, administrators, board members, students, parents and other community members, and they are consulting with Battelle for Kids, a not for profit organization that partners with districts to engage their communities to develop a collective vision.

Mr. Stiles said once the Portrait of a Graduate is created, it will help guide the work of the District. It will lead the instructional practices, curriculum design, and assessment practices. He said Portrait of a Graduate is like your Northstar, it guides the work and brings the District together.

Ms. Steinbach said she is part of the design team, and thinks the process is going very well. She said she feels the work aligns with a lot of the Board goals, and the work is very critical and helpful to prepare the students for the future.

Mr. Stiles said the work aligns well to how New York State is moving in regards to the school requirements and skills and competencies students will need to be successful.

Mr. Temple said he liked the idea of preparing students for the future.

Mr. Buono said the Board has worked over the years to ensure consistencies throughout all the elementary schools so when the students funnel into Goff they have the same skills. He stated that Portrait of a Graduate builds on that idea. He said he was pleased to see this work to get all students to the same outcome.

Mr. Dunn said this process began many years ago and this new work is really important for the future, but they need to be flexible to adapt to the rapidly changing technology.
